Award Descriptions

DISTINGUISHED COOPERATOR

This award recognizes and honours Manitobans who have made significant contributions to the development and success of the cooperative community through long, varied and meritorious services in volunteer, elected or employed positions within cooperatives and credit unions. This individual will have contributed to a variety of co-ops, including co-ops on the local, regional and national level. Current, former and retired employees, elected officials, volunteers and members of cooperatives and credit unions are eligible for nomination. The nominee must have lived in Manitoba and contributed to cooperatives and credit unions.

COOPERATIVE MERIT

This award recognizes and honours Manitobans who have made significant contributions to the development and success of a cooperative through service in volunteer, elected or employed positions within a single cooperative or credit union. The contributions of this individual to their co-op have enabled their co-op to grow and thrive. Current, former and retired employees, members, elected officials, volunteers and others who have supported the cooperative or credit union are eligible for nomination. The nominee must have lived in Manitoba.

COOPERATIVE ACHIEVEMENT

To recognize and honour cooperative organizations in Manitoba that have implemented projects and ventures that embody the cooperative values and principles and that benefit cooperative members and their communities. The achievement must be apparent within the last 10 years and have already demonstrated recognizable benefits to the members and community. Cooperative and credit unions are eligible for nomination but must be operating in Manitoba.

DOUG WIEBE

Doug's career with the *Co-operative Retailing System* (CRS) spans 43 years. He has held positions with both *Federated Co-operatives Limited* (FCL) and various positions at retail co-ops across western Canada.

Doug's career began in Rosetown, Saskatchewan in 1980, as a food manager trainee, after graduating from Red River College. Doug's time with FCL included positions within their Human Resource, Petroleum and Retail Divisions, with his final position being the Associate Vice-President for the Regina Region. Doug's positions with the retail co-ops included time as General Manager for the *Delton* and *Assiniboia Co-operatives*, prior to culminating in Winnipeg as Chief Executive Officer of *Red River Co-op*. Working collaboratively with the Red River board Doug was able to initiate a major asset rejuvenation program for their energy assets, re-entered the food business with the acquisition of five Safeway food stores, the acquisition of 13 Husky gas bars, while growing their revenue to \$800 million.

Doug takes pride in the relationships he has fostered throughout the CRS, as well as being associated with a business that gives back to the communities they serve through donations and sharing of profits. Doug has three children; two daughters Ashton and Meghan and son Benjamin.

Being a working single parent of two children, Eva saw the need for a safe place for children to eat their lunch during the school day. She joined the parent council and worked with the Principal/Parents to create a lunch program at Kirkcaldy School. Eva also joined the *Brandon Group Parent Council* and the *Division Parent-Liaison Committee*. She felt that all children, no matter where you lived, deserved a good education so became involved in the *Manitoba Association of Parent Councils* and then represented Manitoba on the *Canadian Home and School Federation*.

As a single parent on a limited income, Eva was fortunate enough to move into *Aspen Woods Housing Co-op* and

then into *Spruce Woods Housing Co-op*. Living in an affordable, community-oriented Co-op provided not only her but so many other families/seniors stability.

Fast forward several years, when her children were grown up and married with their own children, Eva joined the Board of Directors at *Spruce Woods Housing Co-op*. She has not only become known as the "Grant Lady" for Spruce Woods but is seen out working with the staff to get things done ie. Painting, building garden boxes, etc.

With the sky rocketing cost of living, she wanted to "Pay it Forward" and help keep not only *Spruce Woods Housing Co-op* but all Co-ops remain affordable. Eva has been actively approaching all levels of Government to bring forward the concerns of ensuring that affordable housing remains for not only this generation but for all generations to come.
