Award Descriptions

DISTINGUISHED COOPERATOR

This award recognizes and honours Manitobans who have made significant contributions to the development and success of the cooperative community through long, varied and meritorious services in volunteer, elected or employed positions within cooperatives and credit unions.

This individual will have contributed to a variety of co-ops, including co-ops on the local, regional and national level. Current, former and retired employees, elected officials, volunteers and members of cooperatives and credit unions are eligible for nomination. The nominee must have lived in Manitoba and contributed to cooperatives and credit unions.

COOPERATIVE MERIT

This award recognizes and honours Manitobans who have made significant contributions to the development and success of a cooperative through service in volunteer, elected or employed positions within a single cooperative or credit union. **The contributions of this individual to their co-op have enabled their co-op to grow and thrive.** Current, former & retired employees, members, elected officials, volunteers and others who have supported the cooperative or credit union are eligible for nomination. The nominee must have lived in Manitoba.

COOPERATIVE ACHIEVEMENT

To recognize and honour cooperative organizations in Manitoba that have implemented projects and ventures that embody the cooperative values and principles and that benefit cooperative members and their communities. The achievement must be apparent within the last 10 years and have already demonstrated recognizable benefits to the members and community. Cooperative and credit unions are eligible for nomination but must be operating in Manitoba.

YOUTH LEADERSHIP

The award recognizes significant contribution by young people, aged 35 and under, in cooperative endeavours. This award may also recognize the commitment and achievements of individuals or organizations in mentoring youth and supporting their successes as young cooperative leaders. Individuals, both youth and adults, and organizations are eligible for nomination. The nominee must have lived/operated in Manitoba.

I have two children, seven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren and am member of Willow Park East Housing Co-op for over 33 years. As a member of the Board, I encourage new members to join the Board or to volunteer. I am very fortunate to live in co-op housing and even more so now that housing costs are enormous.

As the Indigenous Director of Co-operative Housing Federation, I am hoping that I opened doors to help others and to show that co-op housing can be affordable, can be the surrounding arms that are there when needed, and to show that diversity in co-ops is valued. We incorporated more Indigenous programs which included teachings, sharing and showing that there are many distinct groups of Indigenous people in Canada. KEN HARPELLE



"I know many past recipients personally and have learned so much from all of them, and to have my name added to this list is truly an honour."

My name is Ken Harpelle. I was raised on our family farm at Cypress River Manitoba. I went to school in Cypress River and graduated from Glenboro high school.

After graduating I took over the family farm and began my association with the Pool Elevator and Mariapolis Co-op. Later I became a board member of the Mariapolis Co-op, which later amalgamated with St. Leon Co-op to form Pembina Co-op. There I served for 27 years, many as vice-chair of the board. I was also a member of the resolution committee of Federated Co-op for 7 years where I sat as vice-chair for several years.

Locally, I was on our church board and agricultural society many years as chair. My wife Agnes and I raised 3 beautiful daughters and farmed grain and cattle until our retirement. We are still very active in our community. We love to travel in the winter and raise a large garden in the summer. We donate much of the proceeds of our garden to Cancer Care and Stars Air Ambulance Service here in Manitoba. We have always been strong supporters of Co-ops whether our local Co-op or others in different communities.

Cooperative Achievement SUN CERTIFIED BUILDERS CO-OP



"Over a decade ago in June 2012, Sun Certified was incorporated as the first Multistakeholder Co-op in Manitoba." Sun Certified Builders Co-op is a multi-stakeholder co-op with worker and supporting members. Their focus is on energy efficient construction practices and reducing carbon emissions through intentional use of building science and sustainable materials. Their newest innovation is a high-performance prefabricated wall system designed for Manitoba's challenging climate.

Over a decade ago in June 2012, Sun Certified was incorporated as the first Multi-stakeholder Co-op in Manitoba. Two years later in December, Sun Certified completed their first Deep Energy retrofit, the "Duvet House" project, and three years after that their first high-performance new build. Expanding on these successes. Sun Certified completed construction in 2019 of a test facility near Riding Mountain to begin prefabricating wall panels for new construction projects. Shortly after their ten year anniversary, the Co-Op had its most successful year-todate with revenues over \$1.2 million and two new home builds completed in 2023. This led quickly to the purchase of "The Fort" at 210 Dufferin Avenue, Winnipeg in May of 2024, to serve as their new wall factory and head office. Their most recent achievements in 2025 have been adding employee health benefits, increasing member diversity to 44% representation of equity denied groups, and the first package of prefabricated walls manufactured at the new facility for a high-performance build North of Winnipeg.

Youth Leadership

CO-OP YOUTH LEADERSHIP VOLUNTEERS



"Without volunteers from across Manitoba the [Manitoba Cooperative Youth Leadership] program would not be possible." The Manitoba Cooperative Youth Leadership Program (CY Program) was launched in 1985. Adapted from the Saskatchewan Co-op Youth Camp, the CY Program started as a 3-day retreat for high school students from across Manitoba to come together develop their leadership skills and to connect and learn about cooperatives and the important role they play in our communities.

Over the years the CY program has relied upon hundreds of volunteers who contributed their time as staff-members and facilitators for the program. These volunteers were employees or board members of Manitoba cooperatives or they were past participants of the program. Without volunteers from across Manitoba the CY program would not be possible.

While the CY Program started as a 3-day retreat offered in October, over the years the program has been offered

on a number of different weekends throughout the year. Most recently, the CY Program has been adapted into an Intro to CY program that can be delivered as a one-day session in any high school in the province. The CY Program is currently at a critical juncture, the program requires a significant investment of time and resources in order to be able to continue delivering valuable youth programming for Manitoba youth and the Manitoba cooperative community needs to show their support and invest in this program.

The CY Program has adapted and changed over the years, but one thing remains the same, the commitment of the CY volunteers to delivering valuable leadership and co-op education to high school students across Manitoba. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered for the CY Program, from 1985 to present day, your contributions have been of utmost importance to the CY Program and the Manitoba cooperative community.
